

Court Etiquette Guidelines

While tennis has its official rules, BRSC would like to remind you that it is also important to be mindful of court etiquette. The following is a set of rules that signify good tennis sportsmanship, politeness, and consideration. Your adherence is expected.

- Do not enter courts until your time is scheduled and court release has been called.
- Immediately vacate your court when time is finished, or court release has been called (even if game is not finished). Change clothing off court if needed.
- Give physical space and do not crowd when entering or leaving the courts.
- Use a quiet voice while off court including behind the curtains, on mezzanine, and in the hallways.
 - Players can be distracted. Voices and other noises (opening tennis ball can) travel easily from behind the curtain onto the courts.
- Enter from behind the curtains of your reserved court.
 - Never walk across another's court.
- If players are on your court or adjacent court, do not disturb them unless the court release announcement has been made.
- Make sure play has stopped before sending balls back to a neighboring court.
- Wear non marking soled shoes.
- Keep personal items on or under the benches.
- If there is a disagreement, offer a let or replay the point.
