Executive Board Reports

President Report - Brian Bernard

Increase in local league fees from \$ 9 to \$12 for all levels was approved by USTA.

Treasurer - Steve Craig

- Assets: \$ 284,368, including \$ 214,069 cash/savings, \$ 70,298 Merrill Lynch investments.
- Liabilities: \$ 7,207, including \$ 2,207 QTC, \$5000 Sports Commission.
- Income for Sept: \$5,174, including \$1,093 league tennis, \$3525 Tennis Apprentice, \$556 Love Twice.
- Expenses for Sept: \$ 10,669, including \$ 554 tournaments, \$ 8,079 projects, \$ 2,452 general.
- YTD Unrestricted Net Income: \$ 14,384.
- Balance Sheet and P & L by MTH YTD are available for review.

USTA/STA/LTA – Jay Boyd, Grady Wilson, Phillip Campbell

STA – Grady Wilson

- STA may change allotments for Level 5 tournaments, and LA may get more.
- Submission process may be revised in 2023.
- May resurrect tournament director training and make it mandatory.
- Jr tennis is growing again. LA is improving, but behind in STA.

LTA -Jay Boyd, President.

- LTA dashboard numbers show adults 105% over 2022 goal for all programs. LA is only state in STA that has surpassed 2022 goal.
- Emphasis is customer service.
- LTA has a strong relationship with governing bodies at all levels in NWLACTA.
- LTA's Growth of Tennis press release cites 4.9 million new tennis players, and a <u>Community Tennis Advocacy</u> <u>Handbook</u> includes a case for tennis. Share with appropriate decision-making bodies and agencies in local areas.
- Two new LTA Nominating Committee members Hassan Abbas and one other.

LTA – Bill Phillips, Executive Director

- USTA Mission is to promote and develop the growth of tennis.
- ATTRACT, ENGAGE, RETAIN to grow tennis. (USTA President, Mike McNulty)
- Old emphasis was learn to play; new emphasis is play to learn.
- To ATTRACT students
 - o Partner with other organizations (Boy and Girl Scouts, Boys and Girls Clubs, YMCAs, school clubs, etc.).
 - NET GEN youth branding product and turnkey resource for school PE. Training will be included in LA Association for Health, Physical Education, Recreation, and Dance (lahperd) convention in November.

 Emphasis is how to connect with schools. Instead of marketing to all, identify potential young players with special aptitudes and get them from the schools to the facilities.

To ATTRACT adults

Use programs (i.e., TA, Ochsner's') and social media.

To ENGAGE

- All need a measure of success, communication, socialization, interaction. A new player needs 9 communication interactions within the first 30 days.
- More live, partner, game-based scenarios.
- o TA alumni tournaments encouraged.

To RETAIN

- Social leagues for adults.
- Serve Tennis includes Play Tracker which allows kids to progress from orange to green to yellow levels;
 one-half day or one-day tournaments with no fees and almost 100% profit for facilities.
- More tournaments provide opportunities for kids to play.
- Team concept- practicing playing.
- LTA is a resource and available to help.

USTA – Jeff Smith

• STA pilot program (Fall 2022 only) with partnerships between schools and public facilities: \$1000 grant to connect facilities to nearby schools. Minimum 4- wk. level youth program following tennis unit in PE, concluding with a team challenge.

Public and Private Facilities - PRO Updates

BTC -

- 240 + players at 65 and Over state tournament; BTC was satellite facility.
- Bossier City Council meeting resulted in potential to build 6 new hydro courts and pickleball courts.
- 40 and Over 9.0 Mixed placed first at Sectionals. Nationals are in Orlando Nov. 11-13.
- Other teams did well at Sectionals.
- 65 and Over 3.0 ladies, 3.5 Men, and 4.0 Men placed first in State. Sectionals are in Dothan, GA Nov. 11-13.
- Resurfacing of hard courts has begun.

BLT -

• Fall season is in progress on Mondays and Fridays.

POTC -

- Busy. Tennis is booming.
- Two levels of tennis memberships; 50 on waiting list for one level; can take 725, but that is too many. Changing bylaws to lower membership numbers.
- JD has 180+.
- Hassan was a coach at Jr Southern Cup in Rome, GA. Team LA finished 6th out of 9 states and won Spirit Award.

Natchitoches -

- 10 new TA participants.
- JD has begun. Level 6 and 7 and 10 and under tournaments will be posted soon.
- USTA leagues in progress.

QTC -

- JD has 85 (at capacity). Need coaching help.
- Need another full-time, younger coach.

Bill Phillips – There is a nationwide shortage of coaches, including women, minority, young people. Main cause is long hours.

- TA player party and FTF-Serve for Fur mixer on Friday, Oct. 7th.
- Four 90-minute sessions worked better than six 60-minute sessions.
- 2nd annual Querbes Cup (one-day mixed level (5.0-8.0) team tournament) Oct. 21-22; teams chosen on Friday night, with tournament Saturday from 8 am 4 pm.
- Additional Fall Tennis Fest through Serve Tennis events planned between Oct.1 November 15.
- Would like to begin something like BLT for 2.5 ladies.
- Some lights are still in need of repair. Brian has a meeting next week with SPAR.

Cockrell -

- Full house for TA; 90-minute sessions worked well.
- TA party held Monday, Oct. 3.
- Excited for rebirth of Jr tennis because kids can bring adults along. Want to seek JTT tournaments.
- Offering a 3-day Introductory Youth Tennis Camp and a Intermediate Junior Skills Clinic during fall break in partnership with SPAR and NWLACTA NJTL Chapter. Participants can come to the introductory camp at no cost to them.
- Fall Tennis Fest
 - Family school mixer will target students at Turner MS and Huntington HS. Students from other schools are welcome.
 - o Family Trick or Treat Day is planned for Sunday October 23.
- The Inaugural Lueburda Jamison Myers HBCU Regional Women's Tennis Championships & Jr. Clinic is scheduled Nov. 4-5 with competing teams from universities within the region. Kids can watch college-level players and bring a canned good for Food Bank of NWLA.
