Executive Board Reports:

President Report Brian Bernard

- Community Partners
 - o Raised \$6500 to date. Working to reach a goal of \$10,000
- Bold Tournament
 - o 168 Players
 - The weather was great and POTC did a great job hosting
 - Special thank you to all that financially supported, volunteered, solicited donations, baked desserts, etc. to make the tournament a great success.

Treasurer's Report Steve Craig

- Assets: \$ 226548, including \$ 148612 cash (\$22773 restricted), \$ 76261 Merrill Lynch.
- Liabilities: \$ 4140, including \$ 1933 credit card and \$2207QTC(restricted).
- Total income for Feb 2024: \$8111, includes \$1914 for spring league, \$3500 Community Partner, and \$1615 Tennis Apprentice
- Total expenses for Feb 2024: \$ 7817, including \$ 1000 donations, \$2079 BOLD exp and \$1470 captain GC.

- Bond Issue Introduction by Leighann Evensky
- Where we are and where we're going
 - Now is the time to invest in the future
 - o Renew Shreveport
 - See packet and chart Property Tax Millages
 - We stopped making investments from the 90s and early 2000s. It was 2011 the last time Shreveport passed a bond issue.
 - We haven't been making investments in streets, water, etc.
 - Can't charge for debt they don't have. Normally if they know debt will drop off they would pass a bond to level out debt services but they didn't decide to do that. This bond issue will increase property taxes in 2027.
- How did this come about
 - o The longer we wait the worse it will get.
 - Want to have as much community participation as possible
 - o 5 appointed and 2 per council members equals 19 people on the committee. They have meetings open to the public and created a "needs" list
 - o \$256 million total for the needs of the city
 - O See report for what will be covered with what our tax dollars will cover
 - Each district is fairly evenly spread
 - o example: water and sewer is technically in a council district but is city wide

- What the impact will be
 - o Property tax increase in 2027. For example: for a \$100,000 house 6.40/month
 - o In 2028 millage will go down and they will decide to keep or do away with the increase
 - o Early voting 4/20-4/23. Vote on 4/27
 - o If interest rates go down it will be less but usually can't refinance
 - o If this passes it will begin with water and sewage. Haven't paid the money to design until the bond passes. For streets and sewage there will be a third party project manager to move the project along. Hope to have everything under construction in 5 years. Streets will take a little longer.
 - Estimates have assumed some inflation. Haven't received bids but they're hoping they've made correct estimates
 - O Swimming Pool replacement at So. Hills and pool upgraded at Cockrell. Tennis and Pickleball court upgrades. Cargill park improvements. AC Steere Park Pickleball/tennis courts and playground resurfacing. Querbes Park demo of pool and rec center and construct a new multi-purpose room in the existing clubhouse.

- Communications with LTA staff passing it along to us.
- Tennis Apprentice Program Initiative
 - LTA is strongly suggesting the use of red, orange, green and yellow progression for tennis apprentice for adults
 - Red ball learning side to side lateral movement
 - Orange ball their learning to move up and back
 - Green ball learning to play at the baseline slower
 - Yellow ball is much faster
 - O Highly suggest incorporating into your program
 - O Jeff Smith is available to meet either by phone or to come out to the facility
- Courtney is continually looking to add level 1-7 for junior and adult tournaments
 - o If there is any availability to let her know
- Reminder about the high school grant pass along to high school tennis coaches
- From Yvonne: upcoming May Tennis month she is getting all the material together and distributing
 - o \$300 for this initiative with the requirement that it be in serve tennis
- Caitlyn is working on 8 and under red ball challenges. If facilities have availability, please add.
 - Using Serve Tennis
- USTA Southern has an innovation grant starting this year. USTA Southern board has allocated \$400k for 2024 and \$400k for 2025 for a creative new way to get players into the game to apply for the grant.
 - There are four seasons, apply for the next season.
 - O The next deadline is May 17th
 - O Third round deadline August 16.
 - o Fourth round deadline October 18.
 - There is a 2-3 week turnaround. If not approved the committee will help with the application to try to get that funding
 - Using Serve Tennis
- Educational opportunities for tennis pros Bill Phillips
 - Friday April 26th at LSU to have first pro meeting with lunch and a gift with high level speakers
 - New product that USTA has called Tennis connect sends in speakers and clinicians. In July in Lafayette. The morning will consist of talking about digital products for teaching pros focused on directors. Lunch at Top Golf followed by two hours of play at Top Golf and then a closing. Fun and informative time for the tennis pros. Only two are happening in the south. One is in Atlanta and one in Lafayette.
